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Phelps Health Homecare—In-Home Support/Private Services

Nursing: Medication setup, prefilling insulin syringes, wound care, diabetic foot/nail care, monitoring of general health and skin condition

Advanced Personal Care: Ostomy and catheter hygiene, bowel programs, passive range of motion, transferring and positioning, skin care, assistance with medication reminders and blood glucose checks

Personal Care: Bathing/hygiene, grooming, dressing, toileting, incontinence care, mobility/transfers, nondiabetic nail care, medication reminders, making/changing bed linens and meal preparation/cleanup

Homemaker Chores: Simple household duties such as sweeping, mopping, vacuuming, dusting, washing dishes, trash disposal, laundry, meal preparation/cleanup, grocery shopping, running errands and telephone assistance
